Dear friends,

These last few weeks have been ones of intense preparation for Holy Week and Easter in our church.

We are getting ready to enter deeply into mystery and darkness, wondrous love and the brilliance of that place God brings us beyond our wildest hopes.

Outside, life begins to emerge impossibly from frozen soils and barren-looking trees.

This is a dramatic time of year inside and out. It compels our attention to the big issues of our lives and the one that haunts me at this time of year is cultivating the resilience of faith in the face of huge challenges.

What makes a person hang on to faith in the face of catastrophe – illness, loss of job, loss of a loved one, or broken relationships?

What keeps us faithful through grief and restores our hopefulness in the face of despair?

In the car, going back and forth to work, I have been listening to a lecture about *Men*, *Women and Shame* by Brene Brown. (You may have heard her TED talks on shame and vulnerability. In them she illuminates our daily struggles so well.)

She has researched her subject and developed a curriculum to help people cultivate shame resilience – that is, the ways we can stay open and loving in the face of abusive, shaming talk and events.

Her insights will help me when I talk with members about some of their situations and I am so grateful to learn.

But the topic has also sent me back to my ongoing study of what creates and maintains faith in people young and old. It is a continuing goal to involve folks here at St Andrew's in all the ways we can foster deepening faith and "faith resilience."

In a few weeks we will confirm several eighth graders in their baptismal covenant. They have studied the bible and the catechism for three years and are learning to practice their faith as young adults in much the same way they will learn to drive and get a driver's license.

The goal is to be able to keep growing and keep going in faith! We don't know all they will face in this life, but we want so much for them to have the generous, gentle, and strong hearts that beat with compassion and goodness.

The goal is there for you too! I invite you to continue in your faith formation and witness. You help others worship when you come to worship. You help others learn to give by the ways you give to others. You model Christ knowingly (and quite unknowingly) as you live your faith in our congregation and community.

It is a never-ending process this side of heaven, **to practice our faith**, and sometimes it happens in times like Spring when everything is dramatic and extreme. The lovely Lutheran insight is that it doesn't depend on us to <u>create</u> faith – that's a free gift of God.

It only depends on us to go out and use it, take it out on the road, and see where we can go.

I hope you will bring your faithfulness, as you are able, to join us in the shadows and brilliance of Holy Week and Easter. May God bless you!

<u>Treasurer's report:</u> Motions were made and carried to accept the February financial reports.

Old Business:

Monthly Devotion Rotation: Jane Martinez distributed a schedule for monthly devotions for the next council year.

Phone System: The technology committee will be meeting by the end of February to determine the best solution for the phone system and voice messages.

New Business:

Conference Assembly Report: Jane Martinez, Pastor Karen, Melissa Last, and the two St. Andrew's representatives (Jayne Lindsay & Sandy Last) all attended the annual conference assembly. Melissa Last was elected conference secretary.

Window Treatment for classrooms: There is a glare on the TV screens in the Sunday school classrooms. Recommendations for the best way to cover the classroom windows will be back to council for action. Use of alcohol hand sanitizer: The alcohol hand

sanitizer currently being used in the pews is removing the varnish from the hand rails and discoloring the fabric on the pew benches. Gary Bruce has requested that the sanitizer in the pews be removed until another option can be found. There will still be sanitizer in the front and rear of the sanctuary for general use.

Property Report (Gary Bruce):

Need to add some blinds to help darken the Sunday School rooms. Interior décor committee to aid in this. Two trees will have to be removed on the south side for better sign visibility and the flat roof over the Narthex needs to be resealed. Both will be added to the budget. Will go with E.D. Chase quote of \$500 for the roof. Plan spring clean up around May 16th, with May being clean up month. Starting to plan on carpet / tile replacement of sanctuary. Will try other types of bulbs to see what their effect is when the 100 watt bulbs are no longer available. Will look into portable display boards to be used throughout the facility. Food and soda being left in rooms and not properly disposed of. Need to pick up after ourselves better. Next meeting February 26, 2015 at 6:00 PM.

Stewardship/Discipleship Report (Ann Stephan):

Looking for help to distribute the remaining packets. The Time & Talent sheets are tabulated, and will distribute them to committee chairs.

Technology (Jakob Iversen):

February newsletter posted on website - and emailed to council as test. The copier is networked and drivers installed on both office computers so they can print directly to the copier .Scan+email functionality is enabled on copier, and the backup system is installed. Received information about changing Church Windows from a desktop to web version. Cost will be \$250 setup, \$65 monthly (single login - additional login is extra \$50 for setup and \$45 monthly).

Youth Ministry Report (Patty Koplitz)

This year's YMT mission trip will be to the National Youth Gathering in Detroit Michigan. The trip is July 14 through 19 and we will have multiple opportunities to serve others, both in Detroit and a stop along the way. We will be learning about urban plight and restoration. We will be worshiping with 30,000 other youth and adults from across the nation, learning how great our God is!

Confirmation Class (in 6th through 8th grades) is a time to learn of our life in the Church, and how to relate to God in Jesus Christ. Youth learn what it means to be "Christian" and "Lutheran;" how to read Scripture, worship and pray; and how to live out our faith in the world around us.

The mission of **Beginning Youth Group (BYG)** is to offer the experiences that will build a solid group of children ready to move on to confirmation and YMT together in friendship and Christian faith. It is our hope that as a child becomes familiar with the St. Andrew's building, it becomes a safe place to come. Along with that, they might then feel comfortable and excited to worship where they will learn, serve others, and attend Confirmation among friends.

These are some of the activities St. Andrews Youth lead and participate in during 2015:

National Youth Gathering (YMT Mission Trip in 2015)

Every three years the ELCA National Youth Gathering draws tens of thousands of ELCA youth from around the country. The latest trip to New Orleans was in the words of one YMT member 'amazing and unforgettable'. (Cost per traveler \$1,000.00)

Confirmation Camp - Confirmation students attend this week-long camp as an important part of their spiritual journey before their final year of confirmation preparation. **(Cost per camper \$415.00)**

Senior Youth Gathering (SYG) An annual weekend for high school students arranged by the Synod Youth Board that helps the high schoolers strengthen their ties to the church. **(Cost per student \$130.00)**

Lifest Tickets – (\$90.00/person) - Lifest is the premier Christian music festival that takes place each year right here in Oshkosh. The YMT group spends the week listening to wonderful Christian music and motivational speakers. For many YMT members Lifest is the highlight of the year.

Junior Youth Gathering (JYG) (\$90.00/person)

Confirmation-age students spend a weekend in an area hotel where they grow their faith and have awesome experiences with confirmation students from other area churches.

BYG Lock-in (\$50 for food and supplies)

The YMT arranges a lock-in for the younger kids, complete with games, movies, and food.

BYG SPAM gathering (\$25

Once a month, the BYG kids are invited to attend Soda, Pizza, And Movie (SPAM) hosted by YMT.
