Dear friends,

We have been working hard to expand the ways we can connect our congregation – to God, to one another, and to the community and the world where God blesses us to be a blessing to others!

This is the last newsletter that will be mailed to everyone on the old mailing list. New postal rates and regulations are kicking in right now. From now on we will abide by the choices you have indicated to us – to continue to receive the newsletter by mail, to receive it by email, to pick up your copy at church, or to use the website to view or download the newsletter.

We have updated our phone messaging system – the old one was giving us some **real** problems and Matt Moore's security company stepped in generously to help us with an answering service until we could assess our technology. In the Sunday readings at the beginning of May (May 3) we hear Jesus describe himself as the true vine:
I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. (John 15:5)

We need to be connected to Jesus Christ – the true vine – whose life flows into us and through us.

In the Scriptures, the people called Israel heard themselves described as a vine that God tended, and as a fruit tree that God grew – with the goal that they would “bear fruit,” that is, be people through whom God worked to bless this struggling world.

But also know that Martin Luther encouraged us to seek the ***Living Word of God*** – it isn't merely the words in the bible, but the voice of God that comes to us through the reading and our worship.

Luther said that knowing the good news of Jesus wasn't knowing doctrines and commandments: “***...but only when the voice comes that says, 'Christ is your own, with his life, teaching, works, death, resurrection and all that he is, has, does, and can do.'***” Knowing the good news is living in the connection we have to the True Vine! This connection Jesus offers us without fail!

March 10, 2015

Financial Reports-

Motions were made and approved to accept the financial reports as presented. Our cash flow is a concern.

Old Business

Education Chairperson- Melissa is still looking for someone willing to be the chairperson for the education committee while she is the secretary for the council.

Online Giving- Pastor cannot be the finance person for this company. This person needs to be available during the day to go through training and be available to work with this company.

Taping of Sermons- We are working on a way to record the sermons rather than have Pastor doing it while she is giving them on Sunday. Technology committee will work on this.

Window Treatments- It was moved and approved to use \$375 of Thrivent Funds to purchase 6 window blinds for the education wing windows.

Sanitizer- Gary Bruce shared 3 different non-alcohol foam options of hand sanitizer that we could use to replace the alcohol based sanitizer we are using now. The alcohol is wrecking the varnish and cloth.

New Business

Counseling Services- Candace Anderson shared that some people in the community will no longer be able to be seen by qualified therapists due to insurance issues. Candace would like to open up group counseling services for the community through our church during daytime hours. Billing would be handled with the Integrity Counseling. Council has concerns. The executive committee will make the decision once all the questions are answered.

Secretary Opening- Interviews are being set up with the executive committee.

Fellowship volunteers- Office will send out the updated tabulation of the Time and Talent information to council members.

Phone System- We will be signing up with Time Warner for voice messaging system for the office.

Crossways Annual Meeting- Crossways issued a list of each camp's needs. Kristi Cutts asked to have these needs brought to the Christian Action meeting on April 19th after the second service.

Community Gardens- We have a request from a neighborhood committee to plant some community gardens. Council asked Gary to go back to the committee to get more details.

Sharing of Goals- (*keep in mind the church's Mission Statement and Constitution*).

Worship and Music- Prints of Peace and worship forms that might be more intriguing to youth and coming more involved in their lives.

Education - Finding an Education Chairperson

Church Windows- This web-based program would make a single database for membership information. An amended motion was made and approved to purchase the new Church Windows program with \$820 of Thrivent funds for this year and be put into the budget for coming years.

Committee Reports

Christian Action- All are welcome to attend a meeting on April 19th to develop plans on how to achieve the mission of this committee. Currently an in-kind collection is underway for the Help for the Homeless campaign (hygiene items). Arlene Shultis has organized a collection to support the Oshkosh Area Humane Society as they move into "kitten season."

Education- Looking for a chairperson

Fellowship- The new schedule is out for the greeters/ushers/counters/coffee for the second quarter of 2015 (April - June). Adjustments will be made when the tabulations from the Time & Talent sheets are received. We could still use people to volunteer to usher 2nd service, and to assist with coffee set-up/ clean-up. The initial stages for Easter Breakfast planning is under way. A committee is being put together to discuss and plan out the Fellowship events for 2015. If anyone would like to be involved, or has any ideas, please contact Chris Ziegler or Jayne Lindsay.

Property- Two trees will have to be removed on the south side for better sign visibility, and the flat roof over

the narthex needs to be resealed. We are planning spring clean-up May 16th, with May being clean up month. Starting to plan on carpet/tile replacement of sanctuary, and will try other types of light bulbs in sanctuary for use when the 100 watt bulbs are no longer available. There are 100 watt equivalent dimmable CFL's. We will look into portable display boards for use throughout the facility. Money has been donated to replace the 3 windows on the west side of the courtyard. The windows have been ordered. Property's next meeting is March 26, 2015 at 6:00 PM.

Technology- Meeting March 16th at 9am in the lounge.

Worship and Music- Jane and Pastor Karen described the recent synod workshop on mission and goals; committee discussed involvement of children and youth. A planning retreat in early to mid-July 2015 and spiritual formation retreat in Fall, 2015 were discussed. Lenten services and activities were discussed. An Assisting Minister gathering will be held Feb. 21. The next meeting is March 17 at 7 pm.

Youth- Pizzas will be made on March 14th at 9 am. We are preparing for our Pentecost Art Sale. We still need recipes for the cook book. Information for BYG Camp will be out soon

Pastor's Report- We have a candidate for church secretary along with the 2 candidates for these past few months. Pastor will be taking vacation to see her mother April 16-22. Church council to think about taking on part-time intern of Connie Weiss (put on the April agenda). We would not need to do any housing.

2015 Synod Assembly Service Project (Synod Assembly is **May 15 and 16, 2015**)

We have three wonderful Lutheran camps in our Synod: Imago Dei Village in Clintonville, Pine Lake in Waupaca, and Waypost on Mission Lake in Hatley. They are staffed and run by Crossways Camping Ministries.

At this year's synod assembly we will support Crossways Camping ministries through donation of supplies as gifts-in-kind. Crossways staff has carefully compiled a wish list of items needed for this coming year. We will bring those supplies to the Assembly.
