Dear friends,

In Spring we are not only swept up into gusty winds, snowy rainstorms, glistening skies, and new shoots breaking out of wintry earth, but we are witnesses and participants in so many milestones in the lives of folks in our community.

Last week we baptized a tiny child, just a few weeks old. I had the joy of baptizing him and marking a cross with olive oil on his forehead. We promised at his baptism to pray for Samuel and through infancy our congregation offers support for his tender faith with SPLASH and at 3 years old with a welcome into Sunday School.

In May, we will confirm several delightful Eighth grade confirmation students into adult membership in our congregation. They will have completed three years of study of the bible, Luther's Small Catechism, and how to apply their faith to their lives in service of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On April 1, a friend of our congregation, Connie Weiss, will be ordained to pastoral ministry. Our congregation has been part of her long years of studies and practice to arrive at this day. She will be recognized by our bishop and our larger community and called into service at Christ Lutheran and Lutheran Campus Ministry here in Oshkosh.

At each of these events we are asked if we will pray for the people in these new lives that God gives.

It isn't easy to grow up faithfully – we will pray for Samuel.

It isn't easy to navigate the adult world faithfully – we will pray for our confirmands.

It isn't easy to partner in mission with a congregation and a campus ministry and the larger community – we will pray for Connie.

And what will we pray? May I share my prayers with you?

I pray that Samuel will come to know the death-shattering power of the cross marked on his forehead, so that he grows into his mature humanity with the strength that undergirds his gentleness and forgiveness towards those God gives him to love.

I pray that our confirmation students will hear the voice of Jesus guiding them through the storms and challenges of teen years into callings that fulfill each one in their God-given gifts and make God smile with delight, and each one of them smile in happy recognition of God's love.

I pray that Connie will bear the yoke of Christ – symbolized in the stole that she will wear as she goes forward from her ordination – bear the yoke with the humbleness of Jesus' Spirit.

I pray for her to know the confidence of his call so that she may offer the encouragement of the Word, the bathing of Baptism, and the meal of Grace to renew and sustain her community – as God empowers the people of Christ Lutheran and the students at Lutheran Campus Ministry to care for their neighbors in Jesus' name.

And in my prayers, I give deep thanks for you. You are partners in a mission that thrills us (and sometimes scares us!) and calls us into new ways of service – such as Feeding the Children in August, and finding new ways to invite and welcome our neighbors into the love of God.

I hope and pray that in this Lent and Easter season you will find peace in Jesus Christ, hope in his Word, and joy in his service.

May this time bring a renewal of our faith that we may go forward in confidence into the adventures God sends to bless us in Jesus' name.

Tuesday March 14, 2017

Treasurer's report: Matt Moore presented the February financial statements. Motions passed to approve treasurer's reports.

Old Business:

Oshkosh Conference report: Greg Egner submitted his report to the council from the Oshkosh Conference meeting held in Ripon on February 16th. Elections were held, and they are looking to the upcoming Synod Conference to be held at Prince of Peace in Appleton.

Blanket Fund: Motion passed to establish a blanket fund and accept the donation already received towards that mission project.

Christian Action Report (Jackie Kuhn):

The committee met on 3/7/17. The following topics were discussed:

- a) Need for Synod Assembly collection – tape, light bulbs (need to get list from Pastor)
- b) Noisy Offering schedule for 2017
- c) Feeding the Children menu

The bulk of the discussion was focused on moving the new Feed My Children effort forward. Sign up forms for assisting with Feeding the Children have

been placed in the Narthex along with a wishing tree with specific ideas for donations. Feed My Children will take place July 31 – Sept.1. The menu has been created for the five weeks. Donations are already around \$1600 of our \$3500 goal. Praise the Lord!

Feed My Children trial meal will be held on March 22, 2017, at 6 PM. The menu will have a taco theme.

President's Report (Jane Martinez):

The Executive Committee met on March 9th and reviewed the Organist's and Custodian job descriptions. These were approved. We then reviewed the different contracts for the Office Staff, Organist and Choir Director. To assure consistency the contracts will be rewritten with similar verbiage. Jane will be drafting these contracts and will present them at the next Executive meeting on March 29th. The Choir Director and Youth Director job descriptions will be reviewed at that meeting.

Several people have inquired about the next safety/AED inservices. Jane and her husband are planning these for in May. Dates have not been arranged yet.
