It has been a delight to work side-by-side with the folks at St Andrew's who make this one of our mission efforts – to help children go to school and be equipped to enter their best dreams and make them reality. Do you know how you have helped make the world a better place for them and for us all?

I am proud that as Lutherans we support children, youth, and adults in their ongoing life-long learning. Martin Luther worked for years with his friends, especially Philip Melanchthon, to make education accessible to many more people than before, so that they could make intelligent decisions, read the bible for themselves, and become the people that God was calling them to become.

Fellowship/Hospitality Report (Chris Ziegler):

On Sunday, August 7th, there will be a fellowship event scheduled for between services, and continue after second service. A ceremony will be held to plant a sister tree to the one our congregation is sponsoring in the Luthergarten in Wittenberg, Germany. The hole will be dug by the youth group, and the tree will be prepared for planting. Anyone from the congregation that is interested in attending the ceremony is encouraged to bring a small amount

of soil from their own garden to bless the new tree. There are bags available at the base of the display for you to bring your garden with you. Immediately following the tree planting ceremony, we will have a symbolic "Burning of the Mortgage". We will bless the tree with the mortgage ashes as well. After the "burning", there will be brats and chips served in the Fellowship Hall along with some German root beer and a special Lemonade type drink. A cake honoring both events will be served following the meal. Any members that would like to bring a salad or side to share are encouraged to do so.

Property Report (Warren Luce):

Warren met with the Hmong congregation representative to discuss wants and needs that their congregation has. They are more than willing to help achieve those goals in any way. Property is currently discussing options for the installation of the hallway carpet on the east side of the sanctuary. The remnants will not be sufficient to cover the entire hallway. With a recent and generous donation to property projects, the committee will move forward with the repair/replacement of the retaining wall in front of the Fellowship Hall as well as repairing holes in some exterior walls.

President's Report (Jane Martinez):

I have been working on the Choir Director, Organist, and Financial Secretary job descriptions. Drafts have been sent to the staff currently holding these positions for input and finalization. The Constitution revisions have been completed. We will check later this fall to see if any further changes to the constitution are needed based on the ELCA recommendations. The constitution will then be presented to the congregation at the next annual meeting. The Employee Handbook is completed. Copies will be made available to each council member as well as staff as soon as they are printed and collated.

Pastor's Report (Pastor Karen Jewell):

Members: As soon as the phones are installed we plan to contact all members who did not pick up a membership packet and invite their feedback – make sure they are connected with us or encouraged to connect with a congregation and active faith life, if possible.

Saints Alive!



I met Helen Mueller in June, 1998, at a worship service in the courtyard when my mother and I were welcomed as St. Andrew's members. A picnic followed, and two delightful couples immediately sat down with us - Helen and Dick Mueller and Edie and Kermit Johnson. We knew right away that this was a special community that "just happened" to be in our new neighborhood. When asked about her extensive service to St. Andrew's and the Oshkosh community, Helen says, "Because God says when we're blessed, we have to give back to the community. I was brought up that way, and my husband and I tried to set an example for our kids. How else would they learn?"

Helen's own parents and grandparents modeled service to others from "way back." Helen's maternal grandmother, who lived with Helen and her parents, started a home for the elderly in Milwaukee. Even earlier, her grandmother's family had taken in children whose parents had died of disease. Helen's mother served two terms on the Wauwatosa library board. "They did a lot of good."

Helen and Dick Mueller have done "a lot of good, as well." Helen and Dick were instrumental in the establishment of Lutheran Homes of Oshkosh, beginning with Bethel Home in the 1960s and continuing with LHO's development of additional facilities for long-term, memory, and assisted care, independent living, and rehabilitation.

Lorraine Negendank says that after her own husband died, Helen invited her to join UWO's Learning in Retirement organization and Helen's PEO group. "Helen is a true Christian who never misses church - she's always been active at St. Andrew's and continues to serve on the recording team."

Helen also has served on the Altar Committee, the Intern Pastor Committee, the Back-to-School Fair, and many other areas. She has a meaningful tradition she would like to share with others - every year on January 1st, the first check she writes is to St. Andrew's.


Tone Chime Choir **Sunday, August 21, 2016**

Stewardship

Technological stewardship is on our minds a lot these days. People often comment on when it is appropriate to receive or send a phone call, to be playing games, to be texting or checking texts and to be conducting other technology-based communications (e.g. please not during Confirmation class!).

At Synod Assembly this year, a break out session encouraged us to encourage our members to bring their phones with all attendant technology to worship! They said it can be a time of sharing with others what you have experienced (and hopefully been blessed by) in worship, so God blesses them.

But just like any power we have: **with great power comes great responsibility** (just ask SpiderMan!)

So when we bring our technology to worship, we want it to function without interrupting or impeding our neighbor's worship or our own. Likewise, in every home we need to think about how to use it, when not to use it, and consider how it is affecting our relationship with others.

In worship it is a no brainer that technology should be silent. And there are better times to use it if we do, so that it doesn't interrupt our communing with God and our communications with each other.

It is always a great idea to ask God to help us with our powers, and to guide us in our relationships. On the internet there are at least two covenants (statements of mutual promise and responsibility) that are meant to help families with digital conduct.
