Highlights of Church Council Meeting

Tuesday 11th October, 2016

Treasurer's report: Matt Moore presented the September bills paid and the financial sheets. Motion made and carried to approve the bills paid. Motion made and carried to approve the treasurer's report.

Old Business:

Narrative Budgets/Annual Budget Calendar: Jane Martinez asked that all committee narrative budgets, that have not yet been submitted to be completed and submitted to Matt Moore for inclusion for the first draft of the 2017 annual budget. The financial committee will meet at the end of the month to establish the rough draft of the 2017 budget.

Grounds Security: Warren Luce made comment that the office staff will be at the next property meeting to discuss daytime security during office hours. Possible security cameras and door releases are among topics to be discussed. Warren updated the council on quotes for exterior motion and security lighting.

Unlocked doors: Chris Ziegler had sent out an email to all council members noting that he had stopped by church around 5:00 on Sunday and the non-automatic door at the Fellowship entrance was not fully closed. Jane Martinez was going to meet with the Hmong Congregation representative about checking doors and windows prior to exiting the building. It was suggested to also instruct any other groups that have a key and use the church during off hours.

New Business:

Hallway/Kitchen Phones: Jakob Iversen talked with council regarding the ability of adding one more phone utilizing our existing phone wiring. It was voted by council to put the public accessible phone in the kitchen.

New Members: Jane Martinez postponed the discussion of new members, until November's meeting, so Pastor Karen can be present.

Nominating Committee: Jane Martinez has requested the members of the Nominating Committee, as was voted by the congregation at the annual meeting, to set up a meeting time with Pastor Karen.

Property Report (Warren Luce):

Warren Luce reported that the property committee would like to have the interior decor committee present to discuss location and selection of carpet and tile for the Narthex and hallway in front of the lounge. Initial pricing has been received by two companies, and these will be discussed at that meeting. Next Property Meeting: October 27, 6 pm.

Stewardship/Discipleship Report (Ann Stephan):

Technology (Jakob Iversen):

Telephones: Call quality is much better with the faster Internet connection, but there are still some issues. Checking with TWC to have them test for signal strength and whether there's any interference. We are looking at getting either the narthex or kitchen phone working through Ooma.

Alarm System: Up and running again connecting over the Internet connection. Staff had a review of reset procedure on panic buttons earlier in the month. Current schedule for arm/disarm is 11:00pm – 7:00am.

Budget for 2017: Will be combining technology and office operations to get a fuller picture of church operations in one budget.

Technology Priorities for 2017: Desk printer for pastor. Replace secretary computer. Consider camera/video camera (but may ask for funding from Memorial).

Social Media/Communication: Pastor is meeting with group from UW Oshkosh on October 20 to discuss parameters for their project around social media and website. Website events and posts are outdated - looking at how to get things posted on a regular basis.

Backup: Look at putting in place a proper backup strategy to protect against ransomware and other potential disasters.

Next Meeting: November 7 at 10:00am

Worship & Music (Peg Olson):

We would like to request \$100 from Thrivent TBD funds for an honorarium for the North High School Madrigals who will sing at St. Andrew's in early December. Motion made and carried to make an honorarium of \$100 for the North High School Madrigals, for their performance at Christmas time, with monies to be taken from the Thrivent TBD fund. We will request assistance/advice from the Technology Committee regarding the possibility of a secure area on our website for choir members. A Healing Service will be held October 16. Additional communion servers are needed. We will align several Stewardship activities with the church calendar on All Saints Sunday and Christ the King. We discussed Advent and Christmas worship services. We

completed a draft of the narrative budget for 2017. Our next meeting is scheduled for Monday, Nov. 7 at 4 pm.

Worship, Stewardship, and Education:

Confirmation: Took a Collaborate webinar from Sparkhouse on Wed, Oct 5, that elaborated on the teaching methods used in our materials. I am grateful for my co-teachers, Peg Olson and Rose Rivera. We are working on obtaining registrations for Sunday School and Confirmation as well as parental permission forms for activities on site for all our minor children and youth. We are gathering background check forms for all folks in contact with our children and youth. Ann Stephan organized temple talks to connect our stewardship education, time and talent surveys and other resources to the worship year. Thank you to Ann Stephan, Jay Klinger and Patty Koplitz who have all contributed to the talks. We still need to do an every member mailing detailing the variety of options both for communications and for supporting St Andrew's mission and ministry.

Oshkosh Community outreach:

The plan to partner with Our Savior's ELCA to feed lunches to hungry children in our neighborhoods during next August (2017) continues to develop. Tom and Marcia Galica invited a rep of the County Health Dept to fill them in on what we would need to do, but it looks as if our facility would pass the requirements.

St Andrew's will be the site of the October meeting of ESTHER's Faith and Values meeting on Thursday, **October 27th** potluck here at 6 pm.

Continuing Education:

Second meeting of ***Faith Leader Mental Health Integration*** to better equip us and our communities to meet the needs of people dealing with mental illness is Thursday, Oct 13.

Family Faith formation – Thursday, Sept 29 to Saturday, Oct 1, 2016 in Connecticut was an excellent class, offering new ideas and models for our outreach to families, children and youth to support their faith formation through worship life, education and social media. Some of this material dovetails with the area to be explored with the group of UWO students who will work with St Andrew's to improve our outreach through social media – mtg Thursday, Oct 20).
