Financial Reports

Matt Moore presented the July bills paid, the balance sheets, and the profit and loss statement for year-to-date vs budget, and year-to-date vs previous year.

Old Business

Codes for copier – there is a code for every activity. They are in the office. Please use your own code for mission clarity. Discussed including copying as part of each budget in 2020 using 2019 as a trial year.

Coffee cart – years ago St. Andrew's bought coffee from The LWR Coffee Exchange for sale as part of their fairly traded coffee mission using the cart. We are wondering if we can start the program again. We will approach Christian Action to see if they would like to start it up again.

Counting update – discussed counting summary sheet and new form to record Memorial Gifts to be returned to the office. Jackie will send non-electronic form to Jakob.

Continuing need for worship assistants – discussed attendance and number of open positions. It appears that the positions are regularly full. Usher concerns – none.

Founding members' plaque suggestion *focus group – April 2019 anniversary – Rose Rivera has volunteered to lead the focus group. More to follow.

Committee reporting suggestion – Goal to send committee reports to the council in advance of the meeting to allow time to digest content before the meeting.

Signature cards – minutes have been sent to US Bank. Matt will let us know when it is OK to go in and sign.

Pastor's Report

I attended the Rethinking Stewardship conference at Luther Seminary in St Paul, MN July 25 & 26. One of the most compelling statements was present by Erin Weber-Johnson in a TED-style talk to us. She asked "What is in our hearts? What do we find exploring our own stories? We are drawn to a Savior who heals us and we participate through our giving in the healing of the world... If Stewardship is a ministry – lives are transformed in the giving of gifts to change and repair a broken world."

For St Andrew's and for the community around us- there has been great joy this summer in giving gifts to Feed Our Children, knowing that it is directly healing a broken place, a place of hunger in our children, families and community. The folks who offer the hands-on support are proud to do so. People continue to contact us from the larger community to ask about how they can help too. August 21 to 24 – planning 4 vacation days with my family – emergency pastoral care will be provided by Pastor Connie Weiss and Pastor John Wills.

Committee Reports

Christian Action Update:

Thanks for who came out to support us at pizza ranch, we raised \$713.89. A fun time for everyone. The money raised will go for bike helmets for the children who come in for the meals. The committee members and volunteers have been busy with Feed Our Children. We have a great team of volunteers, including neighbors, members from Vietnam Veterans of America and Lord of the Lakes Lutheran Church members.

We are starting into our third week of serving the children. In our first week we served 147 and the second week we served 171.

This week is safety week, we will visit the fire department. We have a person coming in from the WI Bike Federation to teach bike safety. We were able to purchase helmets from the money we received from Pizza Ranch, so the children will be receiving bike helmets.

God's Work Our Hands – we have 3 teams for the chili cook-off on Sept 9th. Still looking for a few more teams. We will be working on a few

activities, which are; making dry soup mixes for Lutheran Campus Ministry, making hygiene bags for the Day by Day Warming Shelter, LWR school kits. - Submitted by Carol Spiegelberg

We are busy getting ready for the upcoming school year! Education leaders are working on finalizing the curriculum choices for this year. Nov. 11 is Armistice Day. City officials have asked churches to ring their bells. The committee will work on ways we can be involved.

Pastor will offer St. Andrew's as the site for the Joint Lutheran Thanksgiving Eve worship. Christ the King Sunday we will plan to involve the Sunday School children in worship.

We will use Holden Evening Prayer during Advent worship this year.

A Report on Synod Assembly By Pam Nemmetz

I'd like to give you a brief report on the East Central Synod Assembly which I attended with Steve Last and Pastor Jewell.

First, I'd like to give you an overview of the goals of the East Central Synod.

The Synod cultivates leaders by equipping both lay leaders and rostered ministers for the 21st century. Some ways in which the Synod does this is by supporting lay schools of ministry, youth ministry, interim pastor training, spiritual retreats, leadership retreats and the First Call Theological Conference.

Secondly, the Synod walks with congregations through times of transition to ensure the vital work of the Gospel is carried out. An example would be times of pastoral change.

Lastly, the Synod supports ELCA missions, such as Lutheran Campus Ministry, Crossways Camping Ministry, Advocacy Workshops, and immigrants and refugees.

The Synod Assembly is an annual business meeting that always includes speakers and opportunities for faith formation and fellowship. During the business portion of the meeting, two resolutions were passed.

The first resolution is about encouraging members to be anti-hunger supporters and advocates. We are working toward this through our Feed Our Children program and support of the Oshkosh Area Community Pantry.

The second resolution encourages us to look beyond our communities and support global missions like Lutheran World Relief, immigration and refugee services and our companion synod in South Africa. The goal is for each congregation to choose one or more global missions to receive special attention this year.

Our guest speaker was Jim LaDoux, who oversees coaching and consultation for an organization called Vibrant Faith. He spoke to us about strategies for intergenerational faith formation. By using the expression of church

life, community events and worship events, we can encourage wider participation of all age groups.

Last year we had a special healing service which included interactive prayer stations that was well received by both the young and young-at-heart.

We can infuse intergenerational expression and relationships into existing programs and activities, such as our mixed age choir and the participation of our youth in Advent and Lenten services. I also want to mention the gracious musical participation of the Stephan family in our worship, as well as our Sunday School children.

We are also encouraged to embrace intergenerational faith formation by connecting the generations in new programs and experiences. Our annual day of service called, "God's Work, Our Hands", may be a good opportunity to involve the young and young-atheart in activities that promote service and faith formation.

This concludes my report. Thank you for the opportunity to represent you at the Synod Assembly this year.

- 1 30-centimeter **ruler**, or a ruler with inches on one side and centimeters on the other.
- 1 pencil sharpener
- 1 pair blunt scissors
- **5** unsharpened #2 **pencils** with erasers: secured together with a rubber band.
- 5 black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secured together with a rubber band.
- 1 box of 16 or 24 crayons
- $1 \ 2 \frac{1}{2}$ " eraser
- 1 sturdy drawstring bag, cloth, backpack style, approx. 14" \times 17" with shoulder straps (but no standard backpacks)
