Dear friends,

We are coming to the pinnacle of the church year: to the drama and poignancy of Holy Week and Easter Sunday.

Everything intensifies, deepens, draws to a climax.

We have been headed to Jerusalem with Jesus throughout Lent – we have heard in Luke's gospel how he "set his face towards Jerusalem" knowing that it would mean triumph and tragedy, terrifying darkness but also the dawn of unquenchable light.

On **Palm Sunday**, April 14, we begin the Passion story with Jesus' ride into Jerusalem on the humble donkey – saluted with palms, welcomed with cheers, but questioned by authorities, and headed for the Cross.

Throughout **Holy Week** different stories come into focus – the last supper with his friends, and the betrayal in a garden (we ponder this on **Maundy Thursday**); the trial by skeptical Romans swayed by powerful lobbies aiming to do away with Jesus at any cost, and the resulting death on a Cross (our meditation on **Good Friday**).

Finally, the dawn of God's New Creation comes as Jesus is raised from the dead and begins the work of reconciling each of us and all of us to the God we thought could never forgive <u>us</u> for what we have done and what we have failed in.

Jesus emerges in quiet victory and unswerving love to invite us into forgiveness and freedom! So we sing our joy and faith on Easter morning – this year on **Easter Sunday**, April 21.

There will be so many worship services during Holy Week – two on Palm Sunday, two on Maundy Thursday, two on Good Friday and three on Easter Sunday. We will be offering the entrance into Jesus' story again and again.

Come when you can and slip into the story once more – to find <u>your</u> place in God's unwavering love.

Come as you are able and know that there is a standing invitation (but not a demand) that you take your place among those who worship, sorrow, and hope in Jesus.

We know the other demands of life won't be pausing – work, school, homelife, family needs won't slow down or take time off.

But we will be here – telling the story, singing it, praying it, offering it, and you are welcome.

I wasn't very "churched" as a child or young adult. If I got to go to worship it was usually once for Christmas and maybe once for Easter.

Even though I didn't have the background in the faith, those few times in worship made a deep impression – the story and the experience were unforgettable. I am so grateful – God kept inviting.

Please consider inviting your loved ones and your friends to come and see. Please consider gathering up your little ones and your youthful ones and coming together to take part in some moment of worship in Holy Week.

If it doesn't work for you and yours during Holy Week or for Easter Sunday, please know that we keep celebrating Easter season for fifty days — with the story, music, prayers, flowers and deep joy.

And that's just the season – we will be celebrating the Resurrection of Jesus every Sunday of the year!

The door is open, and God is waiting to embrace YOU. I hope that you will come. May God bless you and yours today, tomorrow and always.

#### Highlights of Church Council Meeting Minutes March 12, 2019 - 7:00 PM

Organization: Officers and committee chairs. Discussed new member and selection of committees. Matt Moore nominated David Olson to be Vice President. Motion approved. He also has accepted the Fellowship position.

Financial Reports: Matt Moore presented the January and February financial statements. Discussed the historical budget practices and designated funds. Motions made and approved to accept financial reports. ADA restroom is \$20,067, as of February 28, 2018.

#### **Old Business**

Annual Meeting Review – discussed and clarified the annual meeting. Need to advertise the annual budget far enough in advance. Constitutional changes need to be sent to the members once again for a vote in January. Will send when we start up the nominating committee again in September.

Encore! room request – after much discussion and prayer, it was decided that we would not be able to accommodate their request.

#### **New Business**

Christ Lutheran sold their church building to Victory Baptist Church. They will have the building blessing with their goodbyes then jump in the car to the Hooper Building for their first service. We are hoping to get people to hold signs along the route to welcome them to their new site. They are moving on March 24.

Pastor's Report – propose we give a gift to Christ Lutheran in support of their mission. Motions made and approved to give a gift of \$500 to Christ Lutheran. Pastor thanked the committee members for their leadership and carrying on the positions they have been in. She also distributed the Time and Talent Sheet summaries and encouraged leaders to reach out to those interested in the committees. Pastor is reviewing the list of members to include active members in the directory. Council will vote on moving currently inactive members to the Responsibility List.

#### Committee Reports

Christian Action, Carol Spiegelberg – Attended the Crossways Annual Meeting on March 2. Crossways is undergoing a capital campaign called "Rooted in Faith, Growing to Serve." They have received 40% of

## CROSSWAYS CAMPING MINISTRIES ANNUAL MEETING

I attended Crossways annual meeting on March 2<sup>nd</sup>. Crossways are on their way with their Capital Campaign "Rooted in Faith, Growing to Serve'. They have received a total of \$672,029 in pledges. They have received almost 40% of their base goal of \$1,800,000. They have begun the congregation phase of the campaign, with 57 congregations participating. St. Andrew's is among the participants. Crossways will not start with planned improvements until 75% of goal is reached.

It's been a while since I've been at one of the camps. If it's been a while for you or if you've never been to one of the 3 camps, now may be the time to see for yourself how amazing the camps are.
