Dear friends,

Is the Autumn a season with lots of study for you? It is for me – the larger church seems to schedule a lot of our special meetings and workshops at this time of year.

I don't mind – I really love to learn. I am so grateful that Lutherans are life-long learners because it is so enjoyable to keep learning.

I know that learning often involves <u>practice</u> – practicing scales on your musical instrument, practicing vocabulary to speak a foreign language, and practicing a variety of techniques and tools to make things well – be it food, furniture, or even a home.

We use the word practice as Christians in a way that made me want to ask: What does it mean to <u>you</u> to practice our faith?

If you looked up the meaning of the word **practice** it can be used in a couple different ways:

--Practice as a noun means the actual application or use of an idea, belief, or method, as opposed to theories relating to it. We sometimes talk about faith practices such as using breath prayer, or going prayer walking, or reading devotionally.

--Practice as a verb means to carry out or perform a particular activity, method, or custom habitually or regularly. We practice our faith by <u>regularly</u> worshipping, praying, reading the bible, and giving service to others.

I think that we practice our faith more in the way a healer practices medicine – our faith is an integral part of who we are <u>and</u> what we do.

In recent years, people in churches large and small have become concerned - overall membership in churches is declining and churches are often struggling to keep going. We become anxious – does our congregation have a future? Will our children have faith in God – that is, practice faith in the one we have turned to in good times and bad?

Where once we would have tried different programs now the experts all seem to agree that there isn't one program that will "fix" our churches. What is needed is that each of us practice our faith regularly.

We have just begun a new practice of faith as a congregation – we are seeking to "re-imagine" the church.

In September, Carol Spiegelberg, Dave Olson, and I met with other folks from our synod to begin learning to re-imagine our church, to seek faithful, new ways of practicing our faith together at St Andrew's.

We have been taught that each one of us needs to practice asking two questions:

- --What is God up to in our neighborhood?
- --How may we join in on God's activities?

On the last weekend in September, a number of our members walked the neighborhood all around St Andrew's and began to look for anything that stood out to them. Each one saw different things.

Then we talked over what the Spirit of God might be helping us begin to see – see that God is here.

The idea is to practice asking the questions, practice looking for God in our life together as faithful folk, practice our faith in ways that can't help but breathe God's love and life into our lives!

We are just getting started – but I confess, it is very exciting. It gives me hope in this anxious time. And I believe it will bless you. Thank you so much for being part of St Andrew's!

Last month's noisy offering of \$129.72 was designated for <u>Emmeline Cook Elementary</u> <u>School,</u> helping provide food, clothing, and




<u>Sunday School</u> Save the Dates!
