Dear friends,

I was going out of church one night – the parking lot damp with a freezing drizzle from earlier – I turned to one of our members and said, "It smells like snow."

She responded, "I never heard of that – what does snow smell like?"

I was busy thinking and I didn't know how to answer her.

The scent of snow is hard to describe. All through my life there have been times when I could "smell" the snow on the air. And I thought about our conversation and wondered if I were making something up – but when I looked I found out that there are poems out there about the scent of snow.

In the old farmhouse that was our home growing up, my sister and I had the northwest corner bedroom upstairs. Our windows were old enough that you could see the slow tears of the liquid glass rippling down the panes.

The top window facing north was latticed into smaller squares of glass. I remember sleeping in the top bunk with my head as close to our front window as I could be, because one small pane of glass had cracked and would let in the air from outside.

When it was very cold I loved that scent of snow that came in – fresh and challenging.

Remembering this, I think I finally have my answer – the scent of snow smells like *promise*.

Promise of white scallops like icing on the tree branches, promise of fresh air blowing your hair and bathing your face. Newness.

I don't have words for the freshness and promise that actually capture the scent itself – just the promise it evokes in my heart.

The bible doesn't talk about the scent of snow but it does have a wonderful passage about the scent of water:

There is hope for a tree, if it is cut down, that it will sprout again and that its roots will not cease.

Though its roots grow old and its stump dies in the ground, yet at the scent of water it will bud and put forth branches like a young plant. (Job 14:7-9)

This is a comment by Job himself, trying to defend his life and prove to his not very comforting friends that all the calamities that have fallen upon him and his family are not his fault.

Job is feeling very low – as if he had less hope than a tree that has been cut down. In the end of the Book of Job, he is finally able to put all his doubts, fears, and life back into God's hands.

The scent of snow is somehow a promise of newness. In Advent – beyond all our struggles with the disappearing daylight and all it seems to symbolize of loss and sorrow – in Advent, Christ comes to be our Light and our Life.

The promise, the scent of water that somehow awakens even the deadest of tree stumps, the promise of new life comes to us in Jesus.

It isn't logical to expect new life in the midst of a season where everything seems to be dying, including us. It isn't logical but it happens to be true.

Jesus comes like the scent of snow, like the whiff of water in a dry place, and brings life again – renewal for those of us living this side of heaven and eternal life for those of us already gathered into God's kingdom. Jesus revives us to life and hope.

And that is my prayer for you: May this season bring you renewal, promise and hope!

Financial Reports

Matt Moore presented the financial reports. At the end of October the ADA Restroom project funds stood at \$29,337.01. Matt Moore presented the October bills – income was \$10,842.61; expenses were \$11,665.21. Current liabilities are \$133,759.35 while the money market is \$49,095.61. We owe ourselves \$84,663.74. Motion made and seconded to accept the Treasurer's Reports and Bills to be Paid. Motion approved.

<u>Dwelling in the Word</u> (Re-imagining the Church)

We conducted a spiritual practice to listen for a word or phrase that stands out and listen to what God is saying in what we do here. What's God up to and how can we join in? Exercise with council: We read Acts 16:6-15 (twice) and reflected upon the questions (twice); 1. What words, phrases, ideas captured your attention? 2. What stirred your imagination? 3. Where do you think the Spirit of God might be nudging you?

Property (Warren Luce)

ADA grant was submitted. Should find out this month whether we will get the grant. Redesign of project may change actual price to \$35,000. ADA grant would give us full \$40,000 that we need to include carpet, wall hangings, paint, etc. Goal to start after Christmas and be done by Easter.

Lighting project continues, should have electricity savings. We are on stage four with lower wattage bulbs in entrances to offices and fellowship hall. Expect rebate of \$323 for this project, hope to have it go back into capital improvements. Motion made and approved for \$650 to finish stage four for narthex and hallway lighting conversions from capital improvements. Gratitude expressed to Warren Herwig for doing such an amazing job on this project






Hunger Leaders -Our synod would like to establish a network of Hunger Leaders in each HUNGER RELIEF congregation. It was decided



birthday

Make this yummy treat to give to family and friends at Christmas, when we celebrate Jesus' birthday.

What you need:

- Nonstick cooking spray
- 3 cups chocolate chips
- Microwave-safe bowl
- Spoon or spatula
- 2 Tbsp. shortening
- Baking tray lined with wax paper
- Red and green M&M's (or sprinkles)

What you do:

- 1. Lightly spray bowl and wax paper.
- 2. Microwave chocolate chips in bowl for one-minute intervals until chocolate is melted. (Stir after each minute.)
- 3. Stir in shortening. Heat in 10-second intervals, stirring until smooth.
- 4. Pour chocolate onto tray and firmly press in M&M's or sprinkles.
- 5. Refrigerate until firm. Remove bark and break into pieces.
