Facebook Live Sunday Worship at 9:00 am and Compline (Night Prayer) on Wednesdays at 8 pm

Dear friends.

How are you? I hope and pray that you and yours are well, and safe, and getting through these challenging times!

The question we want to answer is: "When can we get back together (in our building) for worship?" We don't have a date set as yet.

We need to be able to assemble in groups of 50 or fewer as outlined in the US guidelines and have our safety protocol in place – plenty of hand-sanitizing stations, as well as best practices for limiting the contact between us until there is a vaccine protecting us!

Worship in this "meantime" will have to be very different to protect our members and their loved ones and neighbors.

We will each have to wear a mask. We may not gather for refreshments or even for small groups seated together – we have to maintain the safe distancing between people who do not live in the same household. Communion practices will have to be very different to minimize the risk of sharing the virus.

For me, one of the hardest restrictions regards music – no congregational singing, no choir singing, even soloists must be in a separate room from the congregation. It has been found that singing and projecting our voices makes the droplets with virus smaller, more mobile, and able to go much farther than the six-foot social distancing requires of us.

You will hear many different opinions including something along the lines of "damn the torpedoes, full speed ahead!" (quoting David Farragut, the Battle of Mobile Bay, Civil War).

But when our Lord described us and commissioned us, he commanded us to love one another – be about the business of God's own people – which is to care for the widow, the orphan and the stranger. Those

were the people in biblical times who had no family to protect them and fend for them. In other words, the most vulnerable.

We need to faithfully care for the vulnerable in our midst by taking on the disciplines of masks and distance and other practices that help each one LIVE and not suffer needlessly.

You may recall the parable of the treasure hidden in the field (Matt 13:44): The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which someone found and hid; then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field.

What is that kingdom of heaven treasure? Life! Life together – life for all of God's people, God's creation.

We know how much we are longing for that life together! The first step is to make life possible!

How much we esteem those who sacrifice to help others. That is our mission too!

So, we will wrestle with the rules until we have a protocol and a date to re-gather and a way forward that won't harm our neighbors or the vulnerable in our midst.

For now, our building is undergoing the renovations creating the new ADA restroom, safeguarding those who work on it with proper PPE.

We will keep on offering our worship online even after we are able to gather again in our building. One of the hidden blessings of all of this has been to learn new ways to be together that bless and help those who could not use our building for many reasons!

In this crazy meantime, please keep praying for those who are suffering both from illness and from isolation. Please keep praying for all those on the frontlines and for a vaccine to be discovered. Most of all, may Christ's peace be with you all!

Update on the Accessible Restroom project

The Work Has Started!

It took almost 3 years from the first discussion of the need for ADA bathroom facilities nearer the sanctuary at a Property Committee meeting until the carpet came out of the lounge. We (all members and friends that made this possible) give thanks to God and rejoice in the start!

The project started with the removal of pictures, piano, furnishings and with the pulling up of the carpet (which slowed the process down).

Next came the temporary enclosure in the hallway and the removal of the heat registers. The window on the east end was removed and a temporary entrance was built with a ramp to help keep the halls and doors of the building safe from bumps, bruises, and scratches.

The process of obtaining a building permit was completed and we were good to go!



The cutting of 100 feet of 4" thick concrete was completed. A water cutting diamond blade was used in an . electric saw to reduce fumes and dust.

The removal of 100 sq. ft. of concrete was

then accomplished with an electric buster.

One unknown heating duct was discovered at the start of the dig – nobody knew! The heating contractor, plumber and general contractor will

work together to solve the problem at minimum extra cost.
