Old Business

- **Status** Safer at Home council member Status
- Treasurer's Report Matt Moore addressed the reports (emailed 6/8/2020)

Total expenses in May including payroll of \$7,166 and total deposits of \$7,421 Members continue to send in good donations.

Balance sheet – our base checking account is 13,586, the money market is up over \$135,000 and we continue to be in a good position compared to last year at this time. Current liabilities are \$181,351, up about \$46,000 from the prior year. We continue to receive billings for the ADA bathroom but have been able to pay from checking account.

Profit and loss budget for the month

- we are still receiving offerings and we are processing them weekly, currently have \$13,008 given in the month of May-expenses are down compared to budget as facilities continue to remain on safer at home status. Net income for the month was \$699 compared to a budgeted loss of \$748. Total deposits for the month of May were \$35,600 which includes the PPP loan proceeds of \$22,100.

Profit and Loss for year to date (Jan to May) net income of \$14,472 continues to exceed prior year amount partly due to Jan and Feb receipts, but also as donations continue to be received, and expenses are reduced due to safer at home measures.

New Business: Task force formed for Re-start of building usage: Jeff Ellman, Andy Lang, Chester & Naomi Larkpor, Matt Moore, Pastor Danny Vaaj, Sue Zinth, Pastor Karen – Zoom mtg with Synod staff Tuesday, June 16. We anticipate running at ¼ capacity in worship

seating, approximately 50 per in-person worship service. Expect an update at the July 14 meeting.

Pastor's Report

Worship & Fellowship practices – Working to have a fellowship time on Sunday following the Facebook live 9am worship service. The plan is to offer fellowship from 10:30-11:30. We will try to get the word out via our NET email directory.

Committee Reports Christian Action (Carol Spiegelberg)

The lunch program offering sack lunches outside will begin July 2nd – August 27 and will be offered on Monday's and Thursdays from 11am-12:30 pm. Our Saviors is sending volunteers but we will need additional volunteers to make and serve food. We will be receiving food from Andy Sell at the OACP food pantry. We may need containers. Considering shelter for the outside service. Plan to use the overhead structure and possibly create lanes for efficient pickup to limit volunteer exposure to the elements. Also need to check into the electrical and space for the storage room freezer to make sure we maintain access to the shelving.

Congregational Life (Nancy Kreilick) No report Education (Teri Rucinsky/Naomi Larkpor) No Report Evangelism (Jim Heidl) no report Fellowship (David Olson) – no Report Property (Warren Luce):

Working through the opening preparations by obtaining the necessary sanitizing items for sanitizing stations throughout the building. We have worked with Northwoods Chemical for our products. We will utilize 4 gallon sanitizing jugs with pumps and will notify the congregation with laminated signs. We will also use a hospital grade disinfectant. There is an upfront cost to be fully prepared and equipped.

ADA progress – the "dirty" part is over. The plumbing is laid, the structure and the electrical are starting. We are looking to complete the updates with the latest technology (i.e. touchless, etc.). A meeting is scheduled for later in June with the property group.
