I am praying that you and yours are safe and well. Here is our situation at the end of January 2021:

Worship Means – Worship continues to be available through Facebook, YouTube (St Andrew's has its own channel), and recorded on CDs and DVDs for you to play at home, plus Parking Lot worship continues at 10:30am on Sundays – picked up on your car radio over an FM channel. If you need any help connecting with us in worship – please ask! Call us at 920-235-6616.

Thanks to Sandy Last for exploring and enabling all of these avenues of sharing the worship, Matt Moore and his company for making the car radio worship work, Steve Last for building our "Deer Stand" (our platform for leading the worship in chilly weather) and so many more who have so graciously offered their hands, hearts, and ingenuity to making all of this possible.

Worship Innovations include "Garage Band" assembled choir music! This is made possible by safely distanced recordings that become lovely music using our member's talents. (It works for special music too!) Thank you to Choir Director Brenda Francis for spearheading this effort.

Our wonderful **congregational missions** continue – food for the Oshkosh Area Food Pantry to give to hungry neighbors; hats, gloves and scarves for area children and homeless folks; and now the community hygiene drive for the homeless begins. Even without meeting in-person as we would like to do – you keep on generously caring for neighbors in our community. Thank you!

Just when you think you might have hit the end of possibilities for mission and for worship to continue under such a challenge as COVID-19, the faithful members and staff members of your congregation step up and show you that "you ain't seen NOTHIN' yet!" Believe me, it helps more than you can know.

Now, we offer thanks for the help of our Council, our Worship Committee and our special Task Force. Where we are headed in hope:

Back to inside, in-person worship that is as safe as we can offer! Although we cannot guarantee successful re-entry on a specific date because of the swiftly changing conditions of COVID-19 in our life together, our goal is to have in-person worship inside our sanctuary available on **Easter Day, April 4, 2021.**

We have set this as a goal, and the Task Force reminds us that we must be prudent about the statistics. If the vaccination rates, infection rates, and cases per 100,000 come to levels suggested by the CDC, then we can begin worship in-person with safety measures in-place and practiced: masks, physical distance, hand-washing, and proper sanitizing.

Initially we will use a reservation system to make sure we don't overload our capacity inside. More details as soon as we can get them to you!

If conditions don't unfold as we hoped or as swiftly as we hoped, we can and will continue to use our parking lot, courtyard, and picnic pavilion to offer safer alternatives to indoors. One way or another we plan to offer our **Annual Meeting on Sunday, May 2, 2021.** More details will follow.

Please pray for the safe, successful and swift return to our indoor worship especially for those who hunger for it desperately. And for us to continue to learn from all that God has taught us in taking our worship and our faith life outside our walls and on into new avenues of communication and sharing.

O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good and his mercy endures forever.

St Andrew's Lutheran Church Church Council Minutes December 8, 2020 – 7:00 PM by Zoom

Attending via Zoom: Amy Bargenquast, Nancy Kreilick, Naomi Larkpor, Warren Luce, Matt Moore, David Olson, Peg Olson, Carol Spiegelberg and Pastor Karen Jewell

Unable to Attend: Jim Heidl, Andy Lang, and Teri Ruckinsky.

Treasurer's Report Matt Moore addressed the reports

Total expenditures in October including payroll of \$18,122.23 (expenses of \$9,644.86 and payroll of \$8,477.37) and total deposits of \$13,300.84

Balance sheet: our base checking account is \$5,279, the money market is consistent at \$100,227 and we continue to be in a good position up almost \$32,000 compared to last year at this time. Current liabilities are \$141,636 (which includes 22,100 of PPP loan which we now have the ability to submit for loan forgiveness on) compared to current assets of \$106,632.

Profit and loss budget performance: We took in \$12,626 in income (budget \$18,207) this month, and have year to date income of \$178,883 for the year (budget \$200,293). There was a net loss for the month of November in the amount of (2,982) compared to a budgeted loss of (\$735) resulting in a year to date net income of \$10,888 as compared to a year to date budgeted loss of \$(8,204). November marks the 3rd month in a row that we are reporting losses. It does appear that weekly "givings" have declined without weekly in person services.

Profit and Loss previous year comparison: (Jan to November) we are up \$7,399 in our giving this year compared to the prior year. Committee expenses are down \$4,937, operations expense is down \$699. Year to date net income of \$10,888 continues to be a large swing compared to the prior year to date loss of (\$9,303). This is partly due to salary reductions during the COVID closure, and lower costs of operating during Covid shutdowns.

 - Contemplate Covid budget versus live budget possible six month emergency budget – Finance committee prefers as it is more realistic and can be better tracked based on current actual expenses
 - Controllable expenses versus fixed expenses

 - Concerns over loss of several major donors, and potential impact to 2021 activities as the pandemic restrictions.
 - Concerns over members who had given in 2019 but not in 2020 and what this might mean to future budget

- How best can we move forward to achieve our mission goals and inspire our members to convey the word of the Lord.
- Synod suggests postponement of annual meeting to be sure to have a quorum, and give people a voice.
 - EMERGENCY ACTION: Council approved creating an Emergency action Covid budget, and postponing annual meeting to continue operations until the annual meeting can be held in person. M: Amy S: Warren Luce, Motion carried.

Finance committee to draft 6 month emergency budget based on current expenses that we are incurring in this COVID environment. Need to determine which missions are most vital, and most important to our faith life together. Those are the missions that we need to energize and get behind. The Spirit will help to guide us in our mission. IF we get behind use, he gets behind us!
