Dear friends.

We had our last in-person Sunday worship in our sanctuary on March 15, 2020. I know I wept as I offered the final announcements, because I didn't know when we would be back to normal.

I didn't realize that it would be more than a year of waiting for the conditions to permit safely gathering! At first, we hoped to be back in worship by Palm Sunday, and then Mother's Day and then sometime in the summer.

In the meantime, we have learned to worship in ways and using means we had never explored before! Thank you so much for being willing to experiment and look for Jesus' love in very new settings.

Now our St Andrew's COVID-19 Task Force, the Church Council, the Worship committee and the Property Committee have all conferred about ways and means to safely conduct worship inside our facility.

As long as the numbers of infections and the danger from them doesn't spike again we are going forward with plans to offer inside worship once again in our sanctuary.

So far, the statistics for COVID-19 seem to be improving! And we hope to offer worship inside St Andrew's Sanctuary on Easter Sunday, April 4th!

We will gather with certain precautions in place.

We need to keep the size of our group small (no more than 50 at a time), we will need to wear masks, we may not sing together as yet, and our communion will be individually packaged to keep our members as safe as possible.

The ushers will seat us from front to back and dismiss us from worship from back to front to minimize the risk of transmission of the virus.

You already know the other protocols well, I am certain: we will need to wash our hands frequently, we may not congregate in groups, but must preserve our physical distance.

Out of consideration for the other worshippers, we will not attend if we are feeling sick, or have been in contact with someone who has COVID, or are awaiting test results for COVID.

It takes a lot of discipline to love one another well!

Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote a marvelous book about being Christians, called <u>Life Together</u>.

In it he wrote: "The person who loves their dream of community will destroy community, but the person who loves those around them will create community." (Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Life Together)

We who are so eager to have this expression of our community once again in worship – we will love each other by our faithful actions for others and our faithful abstentions from putting others at risk.

It is all new, all experimental, and we keep trying to get it right! Please know that your patience and generosity are SO APPRECIATED! We could not do this without you.

We will need new kinds of help to carry out our life together as a congregation as we return to in-person worship. There are details elsewhere in the newsletter of the kinds of things we can do for each other.

Whatever you need to do for worship – in-person, on-line, or at home with recordings – please keep us all in your prayers. The Lord will guide us! Please let us know how we can best support you in your faithfulness! Thank you!
