Dear friends,

I just returned from Theological Conference with fellow leaders from our Synod. We held our opening worship, and a wonderful Compline service outside around the campfire. This is Bishop Ann Edison-Albright leading us at the opening Eucharist.



It was a wonderful experience. Our teachers were Pastors Kara and Andy Root, who had met with us virtually last year and came back when we could be together in person this year.

Andy Root taught us a new word: *Zeitkrankheit* which is German for "Time sickness." Even before the pandemic we all seemed to be racing around and never able to get caught up, but it seems even worse now.

He pointed to our technological acceleration, and the acceleration of our social lives – pointing out how quickly our social norms have changed – and finally, the acceleration of the pace of life.

It all leads to a spiritual crisis for us – how do we attain more (the world's definition of success), and how will our congregations act so as to be successful in this time of extreme acceleration of changes?

He said that we stop feeling as if we were present here and now - busy lives that we think should be full lives, but end up feeling too busy to live well.

And our focus on attainment misleads us, as Andy asked us, where and how is <u>God</u> moving in our lives?

Kara Root took our next session to talk about Sabbath. She especially directed us to look at the Sabbath command in the Ten Commandments. Once a week we are called to REST. And you and I cannot measure our lives by what we do when we rest.

In a world that would shape our entire identity by what we produce and teach us only to value our lives by what we produce – children are devalued as non-entities and the aged or those who are challenged by their conditions or illnesses are considered non-entities!

But our faith and our scriptures challenge that worldly evaluation of us and teach us that we are made in the image of a God who made everything Good and then **rested.**

When we rest, we have time to remember that we belong to a God who loves us and did everything to heal us, to rescue us and to redeem us from death.

When we rest, we have time to attend to the people that God has given us to love! God gave us the sabbath command to help us remember that we belong to God and to each other.

²⁸Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. ²⁹Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

In Matthew 11:28-30 Jesus invites us to come to him and find rest for our souls. When we are yoked to him and to each other - we find rest.

The challenge and joy of these messages is to find a way to see our life together as St Andrew's Lutheran Church in a way that embodies the sabbath blessings of God.

I am excited to see where it will lead us as we continue together in faithfulness and practice Sabbath and continue to look for what God is doing in our neighborhood – so that we may join in and follow our Lord into the future God means for us to know – a future that God promises is GOOD!

Thank you for your partnership in the Gospel of Jesus Christ! It is so good to be with you!

Thanksgiving Day is November 25, and we will have some prayers and a faith practice to enrich your Thanksgiving gathering for you to take home.






We would also like to offer a slice of pie to take away with you that Sunday. If the weather is nice we may eat together outside! Otherwise, you will have something delicious to take home.
