# Treasurer's Report Matt Moore addressed the reports

Total expenditures in October of \$16,675 (expenses of \$8,438 and payroll of \$8,236 and total deposits of \$20,331. We did receive additional funds from the PPP loans which have added to our monetary assets. We currently feel stable.

Balance sheet: The base checking account is \$5,580 the money market is \$121,823 the accounts are up about \$17,550 compared to last year at this time. We are happy to report that we have not had to tap into our Money Market this year. Current liabilities are \$140,658 (which includes 24,585 of second round PPP loans) compared to current assets of \$128,540. We are eligible to request PPP loan forgiveness and will remove it from the balance sheet once forgiveness is received.

Profit and loss budget performance: (Annualized as expenses are simply allocated 1/12 each month) We took in \$17,677 in income (budget \$16,337) this month and have year to date income of \$152,623 (budget \$163,367). Committee expenses are over budget by \$500 this month while operating expenses are over budget by \$1,600 wages and benefits are up about \$570. There was a net loss from ordinary operations for the month of October in the amount of (670) compared to a budgeted income of \$1,000. We are ahead of the year to date budget through October by about \$1,450 before considering the PPP Forgiveness proceeds of \$22,313.

#### Profit and Loss previous year

**comparison**: (Jan to October) we are down about \$13,600 our giving this year compared to the prior year, which we expected as a result of the suspended services as well as some notable donor reductions. Committee expenses are down approximately \$4,000, operations expense is up about \$3,200 due to additional mailings and postage as well as utilities and Wages and benefits are up about \$8,800 due to voluntary reductions in the prior year. Year to date net ordinary loss from operations of 900 compared to income of \$13,900 last year.

**Motion** made and carried to approve Treasurer's report and bills to be paid.
