Not much looks the same to us. Work, shopping, school, recreation, and certainly church-life are all so different from what they once seemed to be.

Our families and groups of friends have aching gaps from bereavement and our gatherings remain somewhat sparse as folks must judge the level of healthy participation in groups.

But I am hopeful.

Our church is working hard at re-entering life together. We are continuing to grow in the ways we can support people's faith through worship, and education

We are learning to reach out into a world so desperately seeking well-being once again.

Both our Worship & Music committee and our Congregational Life committee are seeking to understand the struggles and longings of our young families, because they have suffered so much during this pandemic.

For them, school and day care were regularly disrupted so that making a living was all the more challenging. Time to be - simply to be - has been so much harder to come by for young families.

For them, vaccinations came much later or not at all, and the decision to risk their children's health was agonizing.

Do you wonder that they might have deep reservations about attending church, and taking part in Sunday School or other faith forming activities?

Our congregation has always had a special love for children and for battling hunger. Our mission to feed hungry children moves into its fifth year! What a joy!

But we also long to feed our children's **faith** and the faith of their parents!

One focal point for our mission must be to understand what young families and children need as the pandemic wanes, so that they begin to pick up the threads of happier and healthier life together.

Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs." (Luke 18:16)

And I am hopeful!

We will find the way forward that does not leave our children behind, or unfed, or without support for their faith.

I trust this because God loves them, and you love them with such tender faithfulness. Thank you!

As we begin Lent and practice our faith in new ways to grow and deepen our trust in God, please pray for our children, our youth, our families, and for all of us who love them.

God will guide us into the way that leads to life: to health, to renewal and to new life in Christ.

It is an adventure, it challenges us, but it leads us to new life in the one who has died, is raised, and lives again!

## From the Christian Action Committee:



#### **Synod Build**

Our synod is sponsoring a build day for the Sleep in Heavenly Peace chapter in Oshkosh. Their motto is "No kid sleeps on the floor in our town!" Twin-sized bunk beds will be made for children in need. We are excited to be the building site here at St. Andrew's! Volunteers from around our synod will be joining us and other churches from our synod are helping with the costs of the beds so that we can make at least 20 beds that day!

Building Site: St. Andrew's parking lot

Date: Saturday, May 7, 2022

Cost: \$250 per bunk

#### How can YOU help?

- 1. Sign up to help with the build
- 2. Help with providing a meal for the volunteers
- 3. Donate toward the cost of fleece or donate fleece to make blankets for the bunks (fleece material needed is 2 yards for the top and 2 yards for the bottom)
- 4. Donate towards the cost of one bunk
- Donate new bedding for twin size beds. NEW twin-sized sheets and comforters, pillows, mattress pads, and mattress protectors. Quilts that are made should be comfortable for children and may be full or twin sized. SHP requests NO white sheets.

To help with the cost, St Andrew's Noisy Offering for March and April is designated for the Synod Build. During Lent (March 2 – April 16) we will have coin boxes (located outside the sanctuary) called 40 Days of Giving that can be used for your giving.

#### **Help for the Homeless Hygiene Drive**
