As I watch the Spring come to Oshkosh it seems to go in fits and starts. It reminds me to be patient with all the new things that need to be ironed out and made smooth and comfortable for us once again.

We ARE making progress forward! As we have learned to treasure deeply the things we once had, we have also learned to focus our hearts on making the best of the life we have now.

We have just passed our 61<sup>st</sup> anniversary of being St Andrew's Lutheran Church – April 30, 1961 was our founding day. It must have been a year when Easter came early, because our congregation began on Good Shepherd Sunday when we always get to hear Jesus speak of laying down his life for his sheep.

In the Fellowship Hall there is a banner from one of our anniversaries that depicts Following the Good Shepherd. That has been a great way to picture our life together in faithfulness here in this place.

But like so many of our wonderful saints – her fingerprints are all over the life we share here, and her faithfulness helped to shape this congregation and its leadership. Each day we carry out God's mission is a memorial to her and so many others.

This congregation stands as a testimony to those who brought love, and blood, sweat, and tears, and most of all, their faithfulness to shape a community that follows the Good Shepherd.

During this month we will join our synod and community to make beds for little children who would otherwise be sleeping on the floor.

We will be learning of homelessness and hunger as our youth construct a cardboard city and raise funds to combat those struggles for our neighbors.

We will seek the guidance of God to reach out to neighbors with the unmistakable love of God so that they may know that they are also beloved children of God and may find abundant life in Jesus.

We will be planning and preparing the Feeding Hungry Kids mission for this summer. We will be shaping new ways to reconnect with our members, families, youth, and children to support their faith formation.

We will be enhancing the facilities we share with another congregation and other community groups so that our lights and heat and water are as efficient and sustainable as we can make them – because we cherish and wish to steward faithfully this beautiful and fragile Creation of God.

61 years! We have come a long way! Thank you, people of St Andrew's. Thank you for faithfully following the Good Shepherd. It is so good to be with you in this place of mission.

### Highlights of Church Council Minutes March 10, 2022 – 7:00 PM by Zoom

## **Treasurer's Report** Matt Moore addressed the reports

Total expenditures in February of \$19,373 (expenses of \$8,949 and payroll of \$10,424) and total deposits of \$13,504.

Balance sheet: The base checking account is \$31,047 the money market is \$236,663 the accounts are up about \$149,016 compared to last year at this time. Current liabilities are \$118,235 compared to current assets of \$268,851.

#### **Profit and loss budget performance:**

(Annualized as expenses are simply allocated 1/12 each month). We took in \$12,075 in income (budget \$17,131) this month). Benevolence is under budget by \$500 because these monies will go out in March. Committee expenses are under budget by \$913 this month while operating expenses are under budget by \$495, wages and benefits are over budget by \$1,578.

#### Profit and Loss previous year comparison:

(Feb) we are down about \$15,593 in our giving this year compared to the prior year.

Committee expenses are down approximately

Committee expenses are down approximately \$613, operations expense is up \$81, and salaries are up about \$2,915. Current year to date loss of approximately (\$3,500) compared to prior year income \$14,677.

#### Pastor's Report -- excerpts from written report

Met with Patty and Nancy Kreilick (March 8) to begin planning the reconnection with young families and the re-development of our children and family ministry such as Sunday School and other important supports for faith formation.

Worked with Synod Council and Synod Reference & Counsel Committee (Resolutions for Assembly) in preparation for the Synod Assembly in May. Met with Chaplaincy Committee at Miravida to talk about the mission of pastoral care there and the future of Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE). During Lent Confirmation Classes have begun the schedule of half hour of study (about Holy Baptism) and half hour of Lenten worship – with students leading the worship.

#### **Committee Reports:**

Christian Action (Carol Spiegelberg) — Sleep in Heavenly Peace build (May 7<sup>th</sup>) — sign up to help build or help with food.

Congregational Life (Nancy Kreilick) – Patty went to conference and came back with nice ideas. Planning to contact parents of children and youth in late April to better connect with the families. Planning a lockin to raise funds for the Day by Day warming shelter. From Patty Koplitz: In February I was able to attend the Youth Ministry Network Extravaganza in Minneapolis. I needed rejuvenation. There were 600 people in person and another 600 online. Wow. I attended an intensive workshop on racial diversity. It was eye opening and full of feelings and ideas. One of the large group sessions was a Taize worship. Another was called the Blanket experiment. All the chairs lined the walls of the hall. There were blankets in the center of the floor representing Turtle Island (North America). We were asked to stand on the blankets. 3 people narrated the story of our effect on the indigenous community. One man would walk through the people and tap them on the shoulder. Then he would exclaim, "if you were tapped, please step off the blankets. You have died and we pray for those who have gone before. Please return to our ancestors." As blankets were emptied, they were removed. People were relocated on the blankets. It was a moving experience. There was silence throughout the hall. One afternoon I met with a group of youth people from our Synod. There were eight of us in total. We met for lunch. We introduced ourselves and described our ministries to each other. We connected. It has long been a concern of mine that the only connection youth leaders in our area get is once a month, online at noon. I work full time and cannot attend these meetings. I have expressed those concerns to multiple people. I want to be able to combine activities with other youth groups. It's difficult when you don't know who they are. I am hoping to do a cardboard city this spring, but really want to combine with another church to do it. I will start working on it during Spring break. We would raise money to help the Day by Day warming Shelter. I want to connect with them to come and speak to us if possible. A cardboard city is where we would get a cardboard box and sleep outside. We can raise money to get extras, sleeping bags,

pillows, etc. We will plan activities for the evening. We will sleep in the back courtyard of the church. Those are just ideas so far. I am open to suggestions! And volunteers to join us!

St Andrew's is so excited to be the location and host for the ECSW Synod Assembly Service project! We are working with Sleep in Heavenly Peace (SHP) (<a href="https://www.shpbeds.org/chapter/wi-oshkosh">https://www.shpbeds.org/chapter/wi-oshkosh</a>) to make beds for little children in our area who have to sleep on the floor because they have no beds!
