"Be At Peace" From the Desk of Pastor Bryan March 2023

As we transition from the season of Epiphany to the season of Lent, I offer this prayer to you:

Lord, make me an instrument of thy peace. Where there is hatred, let me sow love; Where there is injury, pardon; Where there is doubt, faith; Where there is despair, hope; Where there is darkness, light; Where there is sadness, joy.

O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek To be consoled as to console,
To be understood as to understand,
To be loved as to love;
For it is in giving that we receive;
It is in pardoning that we are pardoned;
It is in dying to self that we are born to eternal life.

This prayer, The Prayer of St. Francis, is probably my favorite prayer that embodies this sense of peacefulness. I was introduced to this prayer while I was a student chaplain in seminary, and throughout my faith journey I have reflected upon this prayer. I love that God has blessed us with different skills and abilities—instruments, if you will—that we share with others in a variety of ways. Yet far too often than we'd like to admit, we get too proud and boast that our instruments are better than others, or we become too clouded to realize the true potential of our instruments.

This month, in the midst of life's chaos near and far, in a world yearning for some semblance of peace, I encourage you to reflect upon this prayer. In your life and in your context. What resonates with you? What challenges you? How is God actively at work in granting you peace? How will God empower you to be an instrument of peace in these coming days?

May this prayer give us a renewed sense of peace as we enter into this Lenten season and journey with Jesus—the greatest instrument of peace—to the cross and beyond the cross.
