Highlights of Church Council Minutes

October 12, 2023

A. Treasurer's Report – Matt Moore November 28th is Giving Tuesday. Budget continues to be a concern. Operational Expenses were at \$13,642. Giving was at \$7,800, which is less than payroll for the month. Matt praised council for doing their best to hold costs. and staying under budget whenever possible. Chris made a motion to approve the report and bills; Steve seconded. Motion approved.

B. Old Business:

- 1. Call Committee Formation Call Committee has been formed and consists of 6 members with 2 alternates. They will be working together with Pastor Asher from the Synod to continue the next steps along the calling journey. Greg made a motion; Matt seconded. Motion approved.
- 2. Nominating Committee Update-We are still looking for volunteers to serve in various leadership capacities for next year. The committee continues to meet on a monthly basis. Our church needs people to guide and lead us, please be that person!

C. New Business

- Pastor's Contract Pastor's contract ends November 30th, 2023. We are planning to extend his contract for 3 months (Dec-Feb) per his conversation with Pastor Asher at the synod.
- 2. Begin Budget discussions-Council members have started to look at their budgets for 2024 and make adjustments based on spending from this year. If you have ideas or suggestions, please reach out to a committee chair or council liaison

person. Matt will be sharing more information in the bulletin regarding some opportunities for giving to finish out 2023! Matt would like your first draft of your Narrative Budget at the November meeting. Annual reports are due at our December council meeting.

- D. Pastor's Report Pastor Bryan Schmidt Pastor provided some updates from his discussion with the synod regarding his contract (see above). He also updated us on his Interim Ministry Training last week. He is also working on cleaning up the copy of the constitution and will reach out to the synod regarding some of council's questions about the constitution.
- E. President's Report Teri Rucinsky During this time of transition, strong leadership will be essential. I am very thankful that we have had so many wonderful members step up and be willing to serve on our Call Committee! We need the same support for all of our leadership roles. Please consider signing up to represent our church at one of the annual meetings or as a council representative. We need each and every one of you! Please don't hesitate. We have great mentors that will lead and guide you on your leadership journey.

F. Committee Reports:

- 1. Christian Action/Fellowship Carol Spiegelberg This committee has cleaned and organized the kitchen. Coats for kids will be collected until Oct 26. Watch for a list of items needed for the Winnebago Mental Christmas Health project November. The Bake Sale raised \$170 towards resealing the Fellowship Hall floor. Oct 22 Pam and Carol will be attending the Oshkosh Conference in Ripon. Nov 12 will be the Pie Social and there will be a cookie exchange in Dec!
- 2. Property Steve Last Property is hoping for a parking lot without the deer stand next month. Weather damage is being repaired, and the red

classroom will be cleaned. Our new cleaning service continues to be wonderful, but there are some tasks that we still need in addition to cleaning. The committee proposed ideas like revamping STAMP or having a monthly work day around church. They are open to suggestions from members if you have ideas on completing volunteer work to reduce budget costs!

- 3. Education Emmy Kasuboski No report, but the council would like to extend an invitation on her behalf to anyone willing to help with some of our new ideas to revive our Education program. Interested members may reach out to Pastor or Teri Rucinsky.
- 4. Worship & Music Kathy Bellaire Butterflies are available for All Saints Sunday. The choir group is in full swing! Peace Lutheran Church will be hosting a joint Thanksgiving Eve service.. The committee has started Advent and Christmas planning. Important updates: We will not have advent services or Blue Christmas this year. Madrigals will be here on Dec 10 and poinsettias will be available for purchase for Christmas services.
- 5. Ministry Site Profile Carol Spiegelberg The MSP is live and St. Andrew's is listed as a congregation in transition. Now that Call Committee has been formed, our next steps are to have the orientation with the synod office. The synod office will provide the call committee with a list of potential candidates that have skill sets that would match well with our congregation.
- **G.** Adjournment & Closing Prayer The meeting was adjourned by Teri Rucinsky at 9:02 and led in prayer by Pastor Bryan.

Thank you to all who made and purchased bakery at our recent Bake Sale. We raised \$170.00 for the rewaxing of the Fellowship Room floor.


Upcoming dates:
